WHAT THIS MEANS FOR YOUR HOME

How to read any CCR in five minutes.

Look for three things. First, the violations section; none is the expected answer. Second, disinfection byproducts, TTHM and HAA5, and how much headroom they have under the 80 and 60 ppb limits. Third, the lead and copper 90th percentile lines. Everything else is context.

What no CCR will tell you.

Hardness rarely appears, iron from aging lines never does, and the report describes the system average rather than your address. The Ohio Valley's water, on both banks, carries mineral loads worth measuring at the tap before buying anything.

Henderson is ten minutes from our door.

The bridge is short and the Water Test crosses it constantly. If your kettle, fixtures or laundry are staging a quiet protest, twenty minutes at your sink settles what the water is actually doing.
