Jasper City Water, from the state's records.

Jasper Municipal Water Utility serves about seventeen thousand people from a surface water source. The figures below come from Indiana's public testing records for the utility, covering samples through 2023, as compiled in the EWG Tap Water Database. State records show the utility in compliance with federal health-based standards.

Values are utility-average detections from Indiana testing records (samples through 2023) as compiled in the EWG Tap Water Database for PWS IN5219009. The utility's own annual report is the authoritative document and is available from Jasper Municipal Utilities.



WHAT THIS MEANS FOR YOUR HOME

The state's records show a compliant system.

Every figure above sits well inside its federal limit, several by a wide margin. Jasper's surface water is managed the way the rules intend.

Surface water brings the byproduct question.

Wherever chlorine meets organic matter from a lake or river, TTHMs and haloacetic acids form. Jasper's levels are modest. Households that want less of them in the glass, or less chlorine on the palate, usually look at coconut-shell carbon filtration.

Dubois County taps deserve their own reading.

Jasper sits at the edge of our fifty miles, and we make the drive. The free Water Test measures hardness, iron, chlorine and TDS at your sink; Jasper's hardness does not appear in the state compilation above, which is exactly why we measure.
